International markets for wood and wood-based products require that raw materials originate from responsibly managed forests. Forest Certification provides consumer confidence that the wood is sourced in a sustainable manner. Forest management- and chain of custody certificates issued to producers and suppliers by an independent third-party, document sustainability throughout the wood supply chain.

Norwegian Forestry Group through its Lead Partner is responsible for forest management- and chain of custody certificates under the two main certification systems currently in place in Norway, namely PEFCTM and FSCTM. NFG consultants have developed the internal work routines and rules for best forest practices, and are currently maintaining the systems for a major Norwegian timber marketing company.

What does Norwegian Forestry Group offer?

- Assist in the preparation and development of national- and regional standards for forest certification;
- Design a cost-efficient forest management certification system, and assist the certificate holder to implement the system
- Prepare the client for chain of custody certification, and assist to maintain the system;

The forest management and/or chain of custody certificate is evidence of sustainable operations. Each certificate holds a unique number, the logo of the accredited external auditor and the national accreditation body.


The certificate holders are issued a license that authorizes the use of the systems' logo and label for "on-product" promotion and information and communication materials.
